



RAGDALE OLD HALL

The Shirley family obtained the manor of Ragdale from the Bassets of Drayton by the death without issue of Ralph Basset, the last of the Drayton branch of the Basset family, on May 10, 1390. By his will Ralph Basset devised his estates to his nephew Hugh Shirley, the son of Isabel by her marriage with Thomas Shirley, Knight.

Hugh Shirley was killed at the battle of Shrewsbury on July 20, 1403. By his wife Beatrice, sister and heir of Sir John de Braose, knight, of Wiston, Sussex, he left a son Ralph, age 12 in

1403, the progenitor of Sir Henry Shirley, bart, born in 1558, died on Feb. 8, 1632. He spent the last years of his life, we are told, in building the greater portion of the present Old Hall of Ragdale.

Sir Henry Shirley had married on Aug. 1, 1616, Dorothy, yougest daughter of Robert Devereux, 2nd Earl of Essex, and the arms of Shirley impaling Devereux may still be seen in several of the rooms at the eastern end of the Hall.

WALTER SHIRLEY BRANCH

The following letter was written by Sandra Moschell and was submitted by Helen Post for you.

My 3rd great grandfather Wysong's older brother Michael, married Margaret Shirley, the daughter of Walter Shirley and Esther Vance. To my knowledge all of the information their descendants have on the Shirleys came from two sources: The History of Smithfield and a letter that their son Lewis Barton Wysong wrote to his cousin Dr. James L. Davis on June 30, 1869.

In this letter Lewis Barton says that his great-grandfather was Sir Walter Shirley who was an Englishman and a member of the British Parliment. Tradition says, he states, that Sir Walter Shirley got into an angry quarrel with another member and committed an act of violence which ended by his emigrating to America. He took up residence in New Jersey and married a Miss Avis there. They had four sons: Walter, Jervis, Robert and James. James died before Lewis Barton was born but he says that he knew James" widow and children and his three brothers very well.

He further says that a shorttime before the Brown raid, Judge Douglas or Dr. Small Craimer visited England. He came across two British magazines both of which contained sketches of the life and character of Sir Walter Shirley (then living as a batchlor). Because he thought the Shirley family might be interested in the articles, he brought them back with him and gave them to some member of the family. If Lewis Barton knew who they were given to, he does not mention it.

During the Brown excitment, Julia Locke (aunt of James L. Davis) rented a room to a military officer and upon the table in that room she left the books & that was the last she knew of them.

Lewis Barton also says that old Mr. Hibbens who was the daughter of Robert Shirley lived in Charlestown during the Brown troubles and must have been 85 years old at the time. She fully believed that the Shirleys had royal blook of Kings Henry of England richly mingled with the plebian book of her American ancestors and the "quality" of Charlestown seems to have

thought so too.

In her widowhood she built a house on one side of town, where she was supported by the charity of relations and admyres of royalty."

You may already have this information from other sources but this is all I have so am sending it on to you.

My father Arthur, was a farmer, trader and politician. Much smarter than I. He was a Town Selectman, County Commissioner, State Representative and State Senator.

Bethel Baptist Church located at Ralph, Ala.

This church was constituted on May 10, 1834, and was first known as Buck Creek Baptist Church. In Deed Book N page 256, Tuscaloosa County, William & Jesse Neal sold land for a church site to "Richard Leavell, Francis Neal and Richard Shirley, the official officers of the Baptist Church of Christ at Buck Creek." This was dated Nov. 14, 1837. Early pastors were: Robert Marsh Meady White, Thomas Norris and Job Wilson. In the 1870's the pastors were Matthew Smith, Redmond Jones, John C. Foster, Al Smith and James Thornton. There were thirty two charter members. Some of these had the family names of: Harrell, Leavell, Neal, Reeter, Shirley, Thompson, Jackner and Vernon.

John Elliot Shirley was born in Mo. and came to Ca. in 1859 when age 14. He rode across the plains muleback, herding cattle the whole way.

A sister, Mrs. Lucy J. Riggs, moved to Scotts Valley where she died in 1908.

A brother, James W. Shirley, became a teacher and died while serving his term as School Superintendant in Lake County. The widowed mother of John Elliot Shirley, married George W. Tucker and they had one son, Joseph now of Washington state.

In 1860 John E. and some members of his mothers family settled in Scotts Valley. He worked as a cow puncher and in the sawmills. In 1867 he married Nancy E. Allen. Mrs. Shirley died in April 1900 leaving the following children: Ethan Allen Shirley who died in 1910 leaving a widow and son Claire; Mrs. Susan J. Wilkinson of

NORTH CAROLINA SHIRLEYS

Robert Shirley, first Earl Ferrers of England married 1st, Elizabeth Washington by whom he had seventeen children. After her death he married 2nd, Selina Finch by whom he had ten more children.

Mary Shirley, daughter of Robert and Selina, married Charles Tryon and they were the parents of William Tryon who was born about 1729. In 1757 William Tryon married heiress Margaret Wake. In 1764 William Tryon was Lt. Governor of North Carolina. Upon the death of Royal Governor Arthur Dobbs in 1765, William Tryon, grandson of Robert Shirley first Earl Ferrers, became Governor of North Carolina.

Thomas Shirley was born March 21, 1761 Va. married Mollie Yates. They were the parents of eleven children & lived in Ky.

(see July 1979 NEWS page 6) Their son:

George Yates Shirley born Mar. 12, 1804 Culpeper Co. Va. married Emily Brown.

It is related that on account of his strong antislavery sentiment, he pulled off from his father's people, who are mostly proslavery, and owners of slaves. George and his wife moved to Jacksonville, Ill. where he carried on his profession of physician and raised his family of eight children.

Dr. George Yates Shirley was a man of influence in home city of Jacksonville. It is of record that Richard Yates, the War Governor of Illinois and Abraham Lincoln were amoung his personal friends and often visited at his home. Peter Cartwritght, the pioneer preacher, and Peter Acres, another prominent minister of Methodism, were often entertained in their home.

Henry Brown Shirley born May 2, 1842 Ky. was a son of Dr. Geo. Y. Shirley.

Following in the steps of his father, Henry studied the practice of medicine and graduated from the medical college at Jacksonville, Ill. He established a practice at Whitehall, Ill. At age 40, broken in health he was obliged to give up a practice of medicine which was just becoming lucrative, and remove to Nebraska for the sake of his health. Here he attempted to practice medicine again, but found the strain to much for his health, and for the remainder of his active life he was a farmer. He removed with his family to California in 1893, later removing to Los Angeles in 1902, where he lived until his death, age 92 yrs.

He served with the Federal forces in the War of the Rebellion, where privation and exposure compelled him to take honorable discharge account of phsical disability.

His membership in the Grand Army of the Republic, although it cost him his health and strengthm was his proudest possession. His last request was the the American Flag be placed over his last resting place.

Henry Brown Shirley married Susan E. Peters of Whitehall, Ill.

Only Frank Shirley survived his father, Henry Brown Shirley.

Henry's sister, <u>Mary Bridges</u> of Kansas City, Mo. also was living when Henry died.

MEMBER Barbara Shirley and her brother Howard are children of Frank Shirley. They traveled with us to England this summer.

ISAAC Shirley of Washington Co. Ky. b. June 19, 1785 and who was married to Catherine Hendrickson was written about in the April 1982, p. 17 NEWS.

Their son, Lunenburg b. Nov. 19, 1809 in Mercer Co. Ky. married 1st. Eliz. Cole and 2nd. Susannah Burns.

The following story is from a letter written following a family reunion on Oct. 13, 1957. The older folk were asked to get together to write the history of their ancestors. The following is taken from that letter, which has been sent to us by Althea Kirkman.

Lunenburg was known as Bergen Shirley.

Bergen Shirley, our grandfather, was married to Virginia Elizabeth Cole and to this union one son, Daniel, was born. Mrs. Shirley died and Bergen later married our grandmother, Susannah Burns who was born in Indiana. With her and his young son, Daniel, they joined a wagon train with two of Bergens brothers, Isaac and Bill with his wife Jane. Also in the group was Billy Miller, Daniel McCatee Sr., Joel Long and Alf More and his wife Susannah. They drove from Ohio and came to Missouri in 1838, and settled on what is now known as the Tommy DeWitt place near Trenton, Mo.

Our grandparents, Bergen and Susannah were charter members of the Coon Creek church and are buried in the little church Cemetary.

When the Civil War broke out, all the families in the community gathered at the First Coon Creek church. Around twenty of the fellows from the gathering left for service of their country. It was said several were wealthy enough to own horses to ride or drive, and some had to walk, but that walking didn't dampen their spirits, to in honor, wear blue suits of the Union Army.

Two of Bergens boys, William and Isaac joined the group and were Union soldiers.
